
Why Every Person Should Have a Right to Access Health Care Services

A legal right that protects patients would be the best solution in eradicating the idea of discrimination in the provision of health services.

Most importantly, individuals should have a legal right to some welfare matter; more so rights to health care. The high court should recognize a constitutional basis so as to embody the legal system with the concept of liberty rights. Having the right to seek health care may be a way of expanding the role of government away from the innovative conception of its task. Existence of liberty rights ensures that the autonomy of individuals is also protected.

Lastly, individuals should have a legal right to enjoy services due to collectivization of health care. The economy should treat health as a collective asset for the common good of every individual. Legislative amendments should also be made, and a role for the new commission for equality and human rights be established.

The government and other public bodies seemingly do not understand how human principles should be a transformation in the health and social care services sector.

The quality of health care does not satisfy due to the improper leadership and guidance to health care providers. It is the duty of the Ministry of Health and Residential Care to guide the health care providers on the standards of human rights. The medical staff should be given proper training in human rights principles and how they are applicable in their qualifications.

I would recommend for protection against eviction of home residents, improved defense of human rights and more robust complaints procedures in health care. Similarly, promotional work should be encouraged so as to spread awareness about people's rights and their value.

The government should ensure timely and affordable access to good quality sexual and reproductive health information and services.
